## Speaker: DR. HAROLD TAYLOR

Harold Taylor first came to national prominence in 1945 when, at the age of 30, he left his post as a member of the philosophy department of the University of Wisconsin to become President of Sarah Lawrence College, a position he occupied for the next fourteen years. During that time he became known as one of the most provocative and challenging educators in America, through his defense of academic freedom during the McCarthy period, his work on behalf of racial equality, his addresses, books, articles and television appearances on social and educational issues, and the development of the experimental programs in education for which Sarah Lawrence College is famous.

In extending his educational ideas into practice following his retirement from the presidency of Sarah Lawrence College in 1959, Dr. Taylor was instrumental in founding two other organizations, the National Committee for Support of the Public Schools, of which he is Vice-Chairman, and the National Research Council on Peace Strategy, a group of fifty scholars and scientists actively concerned with finding solutions to the problems of war and peace, of which he is Chairman. He is President of the American Ballet Theatre Foundation, and a member of the Board of Directors of the American National Theatre and Academy, the National Repertory Theatre, the Martha Graham School of Contemporary Dance, the National Book Committee, the Putney School, the Institute for International Order, Americans for Democratic Action, and the League for Industrial Democracy.

Dr. Taylor's main interest continues to be his work in philosophy and education and, in research and writing now under way, is investigating

the feasibility of developing world universities in Africa and Asia and is presently conducting a study of the curriculum and preparation of American teachers in the field of world affairs. His most recent assignment in the field of human rights has been to act as consultant to Adlai Stevenson in developing a human rights program for the use of the Eleanor Roosevelt Memorial Foundation.

Dr. Taylor took his B.A. and M.A. degrees in philosophy and literature with honors at the University of Toronto, his Doctorate in philosophy at the University of London. He is the author of more than three hundred articles in books and journals of philosophy and education, in addition to his books *On Education and Freedom*, *Art and the Intellect*, and to *Essays in Teaching* of which he was editor and co-author.
